

When you buy a 'sustainable' garment or toy for your children do you know who made it? the working conditions where it was made? was it tested for harmful chemicals and metals? Is the design safe for babies? do the fabrics come from sustainable sources with minimum long term impact on land, water and people? Many parents want answers to these and other questions before they buy a product but the information is not always available.

20 years ago we felt the best way to answer these kinds of questions was to establish our own certified production facility in Vietnam where we could design, manufacture and test our own heirloom quality garments and toys within a safe, enjoyable and rewarding environment.

## The Albetta micro-factory:

Conforms to the principles of the Ethical Trade Initiative (www.ethicaltrade.org) and regularly undergoes Social Compliance audits in accordance with SMETA standards which cover Labour, Health and Safety, Business and the Environment.

Uses BCI cotton (www.bettercotton.org) which promotes social, environmental and economic improvements in the cotton industry.

In 2020 will start using certified organic cotton.

Ensures all fabrics and products meet OKEOTEX safety standards which guarantee maximum consumer safety.




